Patrick Inouye is a registered patent attorney. He received a Juris Doctorate degree with Certificate in Business Law from the University of Oregon School of Law in 1994. While in law school, he served on the Oregon Law Review. His patent work spans all major technologies, with a specialization in the software, hardware, medical device, and mechanical arts. Mr. Inouye has taught continuing legal education courses and lectured at university. He retired from the U.S. Air Force Reserve, Judge Advocate Corps, in 2007. Mr. Inouye is a board member and secretary to the Seattle Institute for Cardiac Research, a non-profit organization performing research in cardiac disorders.
